Katy Trail State Park

Jefferson City offers a wealth of recreational opportunities that cater to a variety of interests and age groups. The city's parks system encompasses over 1,400 acres, featuring 20 parks, 40 miles of trails, 13 playgrounds, 15 ball fields, two swimming pools, a public golf course, and an indoor ice arena. Binder Park, one of the city's largest parks, includes a 155-acre fishing lake, 15 miles of mountain biking and hiking trails, a ropes course, RV camping, and championship-level disc golf courses.

In the summer, enjoy the Ellis-Porter Riverside Pool and the Memorial Park Family Aquatic Center, both offering family-friendly amenities . Additionally, the Capital Region MU Health Care Amphitheater hosts concerts and events throughout the summer, adding to the city's vibrant recreational scene . For fans of colder weather, the Washington Park Ice Arena provides year-round ice skating, hockey, and figure skating programs .

Beyond the city limits, Jefferson City is conveniently located near several state parks and conservation areas, such as the Runge Conservation Nature Center and Binder Lake, offering opportunities for hiking, fishing, and wildlife observation.
